



How to Radiate Christ

To be a “Christ” is the whole meaning of Christianity.¹ To radiate Christ is the whole meaning of the Christian apostolate.

Everybody knows that the Christian is bound as far as possible to be a living “Christ,” another Jesus Christ. How is he to do this? There are various books which will tell him: *In Christ Jesus*,² *Christ the life of the soul*, by Abbot Marmion ;³ and in a shorter form: *One with Jesus*, by P. de Jaegher, S.J.⁴

But to be a Christ for one’s own personal benefit is not enough; we have to Christianize those around us; in a word, we have to radiate Christ. The following pages are intended to suggest to souls that are athirst for apostolic conquest, the means by which their apostolate may be made successful.

What method must we use in order to radiate Christ? Well, let us ask ourselves what method Our Lord Himself used to gain the adherence of His contemporaries. Antecedently it must be admitted that the means which He chose are the very means which I should do well to make my own. He, the Redeemer, possesses all the secrets of Redemption. Accordingly, however His methods may astonish or even scandalize me, if I see that He chooses this formula rather than that other, it is for me to submit to His judgement. His formula is certainly the good

one; it must become my formula, too.

But it may be objected that Jesus Christ, the Head of the Body, possessed precious resources which I, a mere member of that Body, do not possess.

Admittedly, Jesus possessed in His own right three qualifications which set Him entirely apart:

He was the Son of God.

He had at His disposal the power of miracles.

He had a personal charm beyond compare.

But surely, continues our objector, we must lose heart from the very beginning when we consider that Jesus so far surpasses us in resources for the conquest of souls. Not at all. If we begin by contemplating what is beyond our imitation and set our divine Head on a pedestal infinitely beyond our reach, we shall inevitably take courage. Is it not well that the great Chief whom we serve is evidently and incomparably great? And when we see how high He stands, how brightly and clearly His power shines forth, are we not filled with a boundless confidence? When Jesus says: “Be of good heart, I have overcome the world,” our hearts take courage; for we see that He who leads is a Person of a different calibre from us.

He is the sort of leader that we can march with. Under Him, victory is assured.

But let us hasten to add: if Christ, our divine Eldest Brother, possesses means of supernatural conquest which belong to Him alone, we must not forget that He often deigned to forgo the use of these weapons, to manifest them as little as possible and, almost under protest, that in a great number of cases He vouchsafed to appear to His contemporaries as if He were a mere man among men, endowed with nothing more than a human power. And to that extent, the example

which He has given of the manner in which we should influence others retains its full value.

But we must say more. We must say that His divine technique in the supernatural conquest of the world must be our technique too.

What did Christ do in order to win His contemporaries? The Creed tells us, and we recite the words often, perhaps without understanding that they lay upon us a greater obligation than we think. It is all summed up in four phrases:

A descent, a descent from heaven; – the Incarnation; – the Cross ; – the Burial.

Primarily and immediately these expressions have reference only to Our Lord. But, if only we understand them aright, they may easily be adapted to us also, and they wonderfully describe the only true means which any saviour of souls must choose if his apostolate is to be effective.

The servant is not greater than his Master. Subordinate saviours cannot choose any other method than that of the principal Saviour. And the rule which governs all apostolic action,

all redemptive conquest, remains always that which Our Lord determined. Every apostle, if his work is to be fruitful, needs:

A descent, a coming down from heaven;
An incarnation;
Renunciation;
Burial.

Our purpose is just to explain what this means. It means so many things! Things which only few people understand. And this is why there are so few genuine saviours of souls, so few people who, from God's point of view, exert real influence upon those around them.

But we may assert now from the very beginning, and as you read on you will become more and more convinced, that any method for the salvation of souls other than that of the Saviour, is a fantastic creation of the imagination, an impossibility.

If you are not prepared to submit to the truth, then read no further.
